

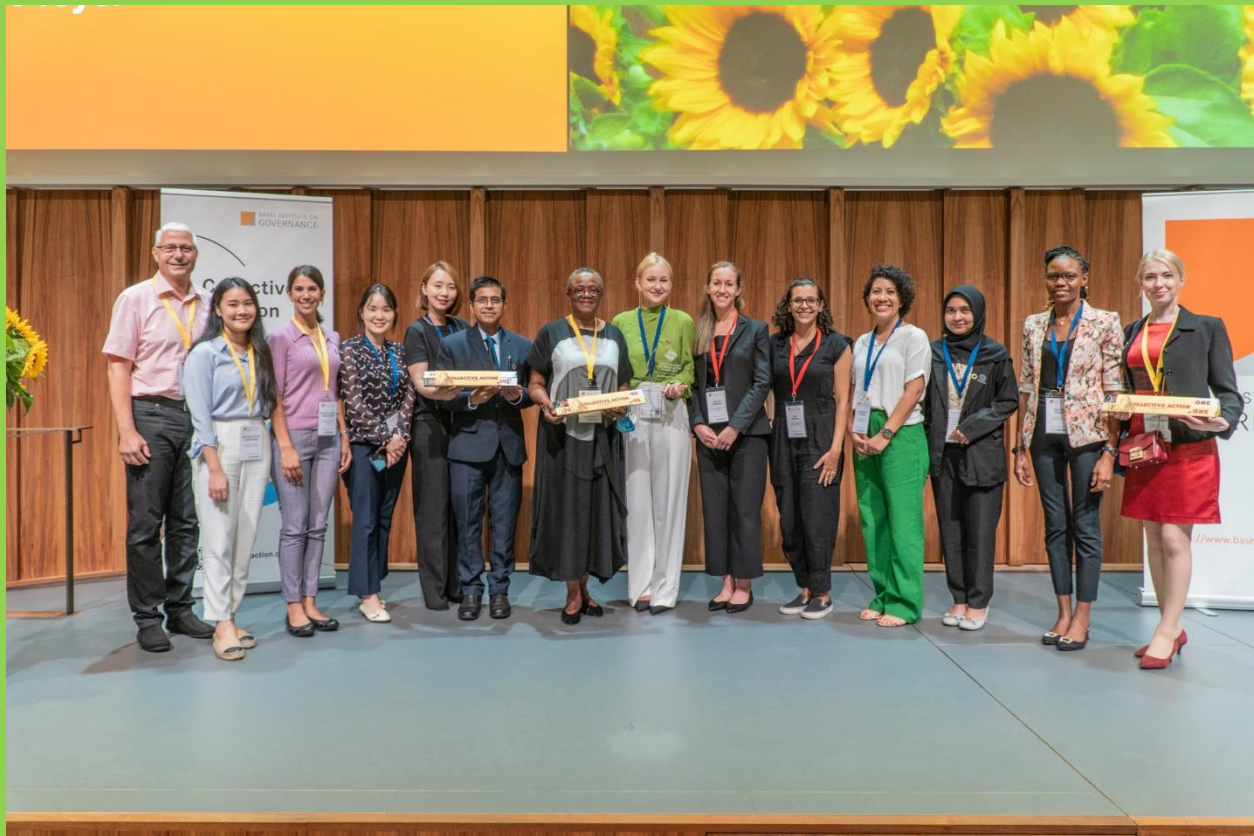


4th International Collective Action Conference 2022

The Basel Institute is an international and independent not-for-profit organization working worldwide with the public and private sectors to counter corruption and other financial crimes and to improve the quality of governance.

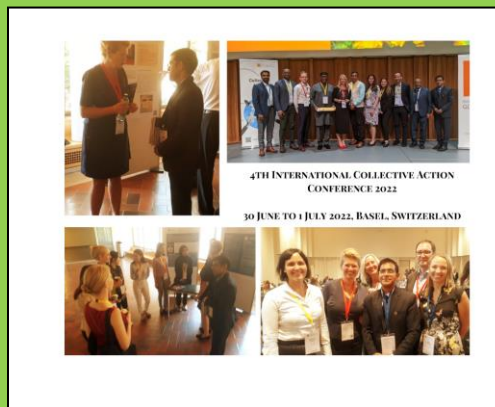
Their goal to reach across silos and add momentum to the growing global recognition that Collective Action needs to be a central element of corruption prevention.
